Shopping in Hong Kong

Ultramodern, bustling Hong Kong is one of the world's best shopping cities, an essential visit for all shopaholics searching for a bargain. There are several areas to choose from. The urban district of Kowloon, meaning "Nine Dragons," attracts thousands of tourists every year. A popular first stop here is the modern shopping district, Tsim Sha Tsui. However, if you prefer to absorb the atmosphere of more traditional markets, then the Yau Ma Tei and Mong Kok districts, also in Kowloon, are probably more your style.

A great place to explore at night is Nathan Road and the surrounding streets, which are filled with flashing neon signs. You can buy almost anything here. Look for bargains on electrical goods and jewelry.

It's possible to buy traditional items in Hong Kong. You can find wedding clothes on Shanghai Street, and stores on Ning Po Street sell the colored paper models of houses and cars as well as the bank notes that are burned when a person dies so that the person will be wealthy in the afterlife.

Further along Shanghai Street is the popular night market. It's full of brightly colored lights and wonderful cooking smells. Watch the fortune-tellers whose trained birds choose pieces of paper to predict a person's future, and eat delicious noodles, seafood, and other late-night snacks at the inexpensive food stalls.

Mong Kok is a place where there are many traditional shops, food stalls, and markets. Tourists often avoid this area because criminals known as "triad gangs" are based there. However, this is an excellent place to try local foods that have not been changed to suit tourists' tastes. It's unlikely to be dangerous for foreigners, so if you'd like to see some of the more unspoiled areas of Hong Kong, Mong Kok is definitely worth exploring.

One thing is certain about a shopping trip to Hong Kong: you'll leave with a lot less money than you arrived with, and a much heavier suitcase!

Jonathan My favorite movie is *Apocalypse Now*. It's a war movie and it's set in Cambodia in the late sixties, at the time of the Vietnam War. However, it was filmed in the Philippines because it was impossible to make a movie in Cambodia at that time. It was directed by an American with an Italian name, Francis Ford Coppola, and it starred a very young Martin Sheen, who is now better known as the American actor who plays the president in the hit TV series *The West Wing*. Sheen's real name, by the way, is Ramon Estevez. Sheen's father, Francisco Estevez, was from Spain, though Sheen himself was born in the United States.

Apocalypse Now is loosely based on a famous novel called *Heart of Darkness*, by the nineteenth-century writer Joseph Conrad. Conrad was born in Poland, but he became a naturalized British citizen and spent much of his life in England. He wrote all of his novels in English. In Conrad's story, a man is sent along the river Congo in Africa to find a man called Kurtz. In Coppola's movie, a similar story takes place in the heart of the Cambodian jungle. It's an incredibly powerful movie.
