Consonant sounds

Customers A and B

You and your friend have both got a shopping list, but you can only buy things which contain certain sounds. If you can't find what you want, accept something else.

Customer A: The things you buy must contain the sounds /θ/ (thirty), /s/ (say), /z/ (leisure), or /tʃ/ (cheat).

Customer B: The things you buy must contain the sounds /ð/ (they), /z/ (zero), /ʃ/ (shop), or /dʒ/ (object).

Shop assistants A and B

Shop assistant B: The things you sell must contain the sounds /ð/ (they), /z/ (zero), /ʃ/ (shop), and /dʒ/ (object).
